





Journeying with Lisa Baker On a Path of Music and Spirit




hen Lisa Baker released Song For A New Day in 2003, it was enough to make heads spin at the speed of light. Skip the "chick guitarist" cliché, please. Baker is an artist in the purest sense of the word: musician, songwriter, performer. The type of extraordinary talent for whom the cream of the crop line up, including Joseph, Regi and Victor Wooten, who all play on her album and whom she regularly sits in with in Nashville. When she's not onstage, Baker can be found

performing in two Sunday services at her church and, on most afternoons, teaching piano and guitar. She is also putting the finishing touches on the songs that will become her next album, which will be recorded at her studio, the Lab, and followed by a summer tour of the East Coast.

InsideCx: What attracted you to the guita When did you begin developing your own style, and who were/are your influences? L.B.: When I was a senior in high school, my mother brought home an acoustic guitar. From the first moment I held it in my arms I knew it was for me. In those days I just learned church and folk tunes from friends, strumming and finger picking. It wasn't until I hooked up with the Wooten Family that I started the path of lead playing. They are all my brothers now, but Regi was my teacher for many years. I don't think of myself as having my own style. I'm still searching, always studying, trying to fill in the gaps of knowledge. But I will admit that when I wrote "Night Ride." I felt I was hitting on something by combining this folk/jazz voice with shredding guitar. With regard to my influences as a songwriter, there was this Norwegian friend, Jan Ovland, whom I tried to emulate for modern folk. For the album I just pulled from different genres and artists, like George Benson, Alan Holdsworth, Prince, Frank Gambale. Of course,

Victor Wooten has been a big influence on me stylistically, along with his brothers and some of the other musicians hanging out here, like Bela Fleck, Edgar Meyers and Keith Horne.

InsideCx: Prior to relocating to Nashville, you were touring and performing, and opening for some major names. How did these gigs come about? have been fortunate to open for some great musicians. To tell the truth, there was this agent in Seattle I was quite close with and he did all the business work.

InsideCx: Why the move to Nashville? That agent became my ex-husband and he was offered a position with the William Morris Agency. The agency gave him the opportunity to move to LA., New York or Nashville. I had run into Merrilee Rush's boyfriend, Bill McCarthey, and he had just been to Nashville. He was so enthusiastic about the city. He said that everybody writes songs there. So I told my ex-husband where I wanted to go and that's where we went.

insideCr: Designing and building your guitar was quite an endeavor. What prompted its creation? What are your key pieces of gear, and are you big on technology? I was in Norway many years ago and had a friend there whose mother taught the traditional Rosemulding at a University. She had painted her son's bass, which gave me the idea, and that Norwegian songwriting friend of mine, Jan, paid her to paint the body and neck for me for a Christmas/birthday present. It has taken some years to evolve the rest of that guitar. I discovered along the way the concept of a guitar that was decidedly ferninine and simultaneously from the past and the future. I really am not a gear head—just ask my guitar buddies who have had to spend time with me and an amp. Keeping it simple is key. I like a good combo tube amp with thick distortion and a wah. Any other toys are just that. I do use a little compression, some delay, verb and a little flange sometimes.

insideCo: How did your band get together? What do you look for in musicians in order to take your music from studio to stage? And are you still working with the Wooten Brothers? Those are good questions. Band members are always changing and I go in spurts gigging with them. I still sit in with the Wooten Brothers occasionally. As far as what I look for in musicians, it's important for them to have chops and yet be sensitive to the music. I like to feature each musician onstage and really celebrate them.

InsideCx: Your spirituality is strong. Have you always had this faith? Who instilled it in you, and how does it impact your life? I had a medical condition when I was a child that sent me questioning for a greater love. My mom used to take me to churches by my request. Now, however, my faith also encompasses some years of Eastern philosophical studies

The impact that faith has had on my life is so vast that it's almost impossible for me to dissect—it's really the center of my existence. Living and loving come first and playing guitar just flows naturally from this. These days I really like playing Black gospel as well as original music.

I guess I want to bring myself to a higher state of consciousness and bring others along with me. &

Song For A New Day (Lisa Baker Music)

Nashville-based Lisa Baker is a first-rate singer-songwriter, engineer and producer who also happens to play a hot electric guitar. She even designed her own guitar having ax-master Joe Glaser assemble the Fender body, Warmoth neck, Seymour Duncan pickups and Floyd Rose tremolo all retrofitted with colored lights down the neck and inside the knobs. Baker approaches her music with telling results on her self-produced 2004 CD Song For A New Day. A mostly instrumental affair, finessed with Baker's accomplished guitar prowess, inviting vocals and seat-vocal backups, Song For A New Day sounds inspired by Wes Montgomery and Jimi Hendrix while a cover of the Freddie Hubbard classic "Little Sunflower" demonstrates Baker's grasp of the classic jazz-fusion medium.
